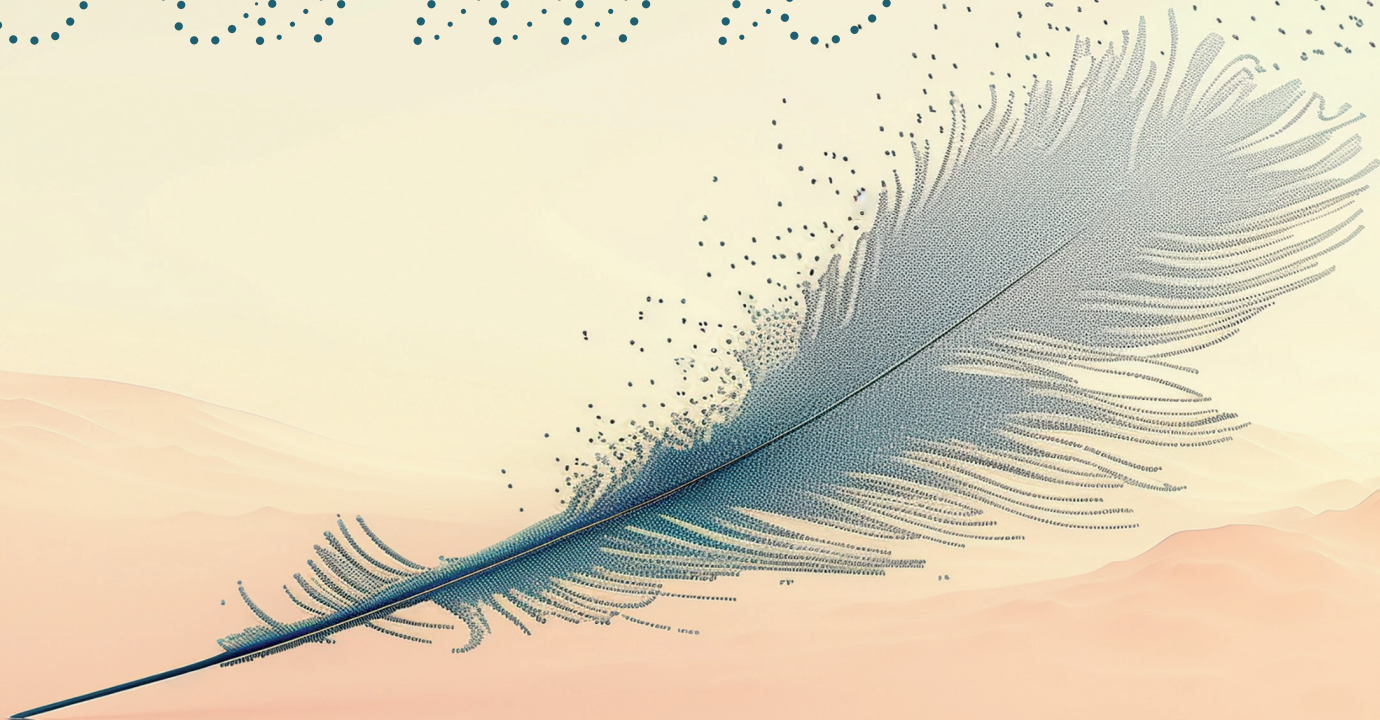

Puntino is (maybe the first) dotted script typeface and not made up of grid-based dots.

They are optical corrected and there is always the same distance between the dots, with the aim to create more harmonic letterforms. The dots also vary gradually in size to reflect the thickening and thinning of strokes, giving the letterforms a sophisticated overall look.

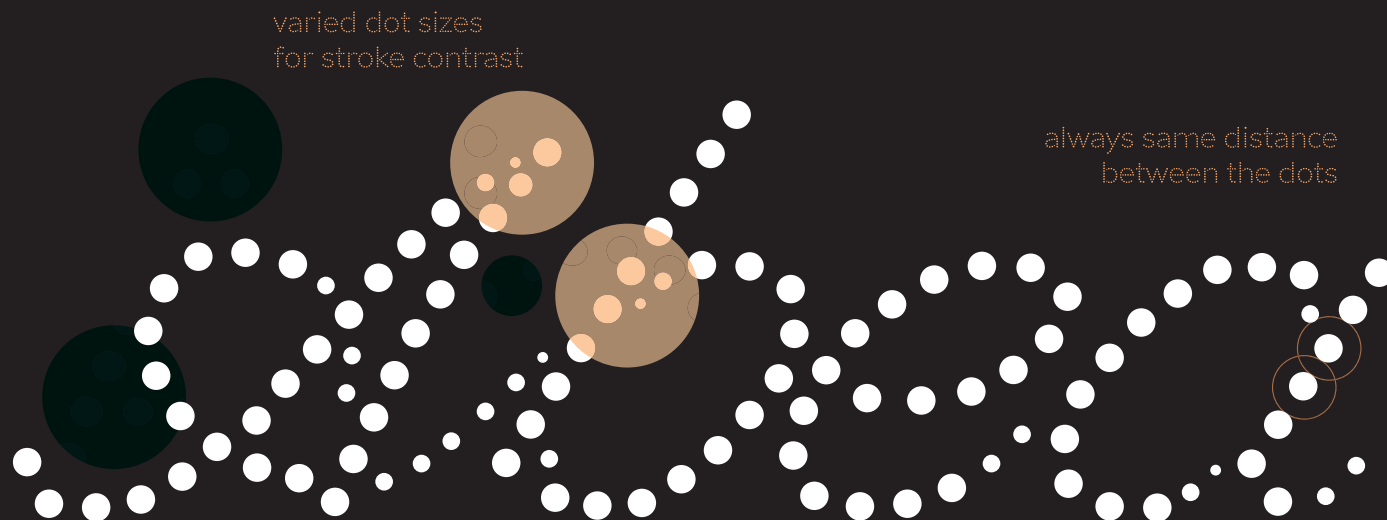

DESIGN CONCEPT



The problem with the design of dot lettering lies in the even distribution of the distances between the dots. Regardless of the shape and length of a line, the spacing between the dots should be precise and even in order to end exactly on the dot. In the Puntino font, the spacing between the dots and the dot sizes are varied minimally to compensate for this negative effect. In addition, a flexible space is used for dipping curves, such as the letters a, d, b, q, p and g. Minimal stroke width contrast and the optical equalisation of thickening contribute to a harmonious overall appearance of the font.
